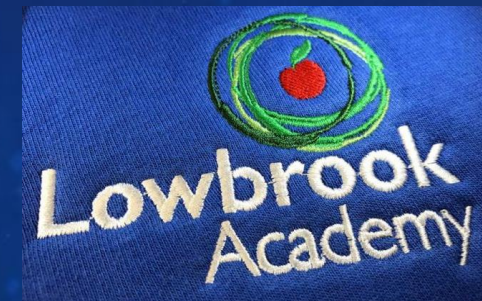




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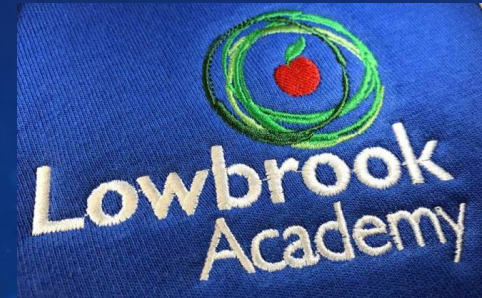
Covid-19 measures

- We continue to have measures in place to ensure your children and the staff are safe here at Lowbrook.
- The children wash or sanitise their hands frequently throughout the day.
- We are cleaning frequently touched surfaces more regularly during the day, such as tables, door handles, ipads etc
- Toilets are cleaned at lunchtime.
- Sanitiser is provided in all classrooms and bins positioned in the best possible place to encourage the 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' method.
- Windows and doors are all open as much as possible to increase ventilation in classrooms. CO2 monitors in all classrooms.

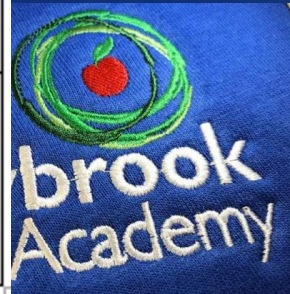

P4C – Philosophy for children

Philosophy for Children involves group discussions about ethical or philosophical topics, such as fairness and truth.

Discussions are designed to encourage children to ask questions, construct arguments and engage in reasoned debate.

Gives children the opportunity to see that their ideas have value and that other people have different ideas that also have value.

It builds confidence and gives the children a voice.

Lowbrook Mile

The idea behind this is to keep our children fit and healthy, whilst also learning to support and encourage.

We aim to run the Mile every day, which equates to 7 laps of the running track.

The children just need to change into their trainers for this, so it's important that they are in school all week.

PE kits

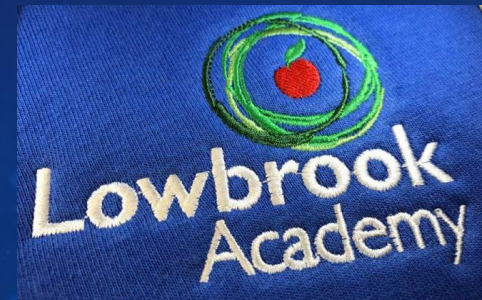
- This term, P.E will be on a Monday (gymnastics) and Thursday (football).

- Spelling test each Friday morning. Spellings are given out on a Friday to be learnt throughout the week.

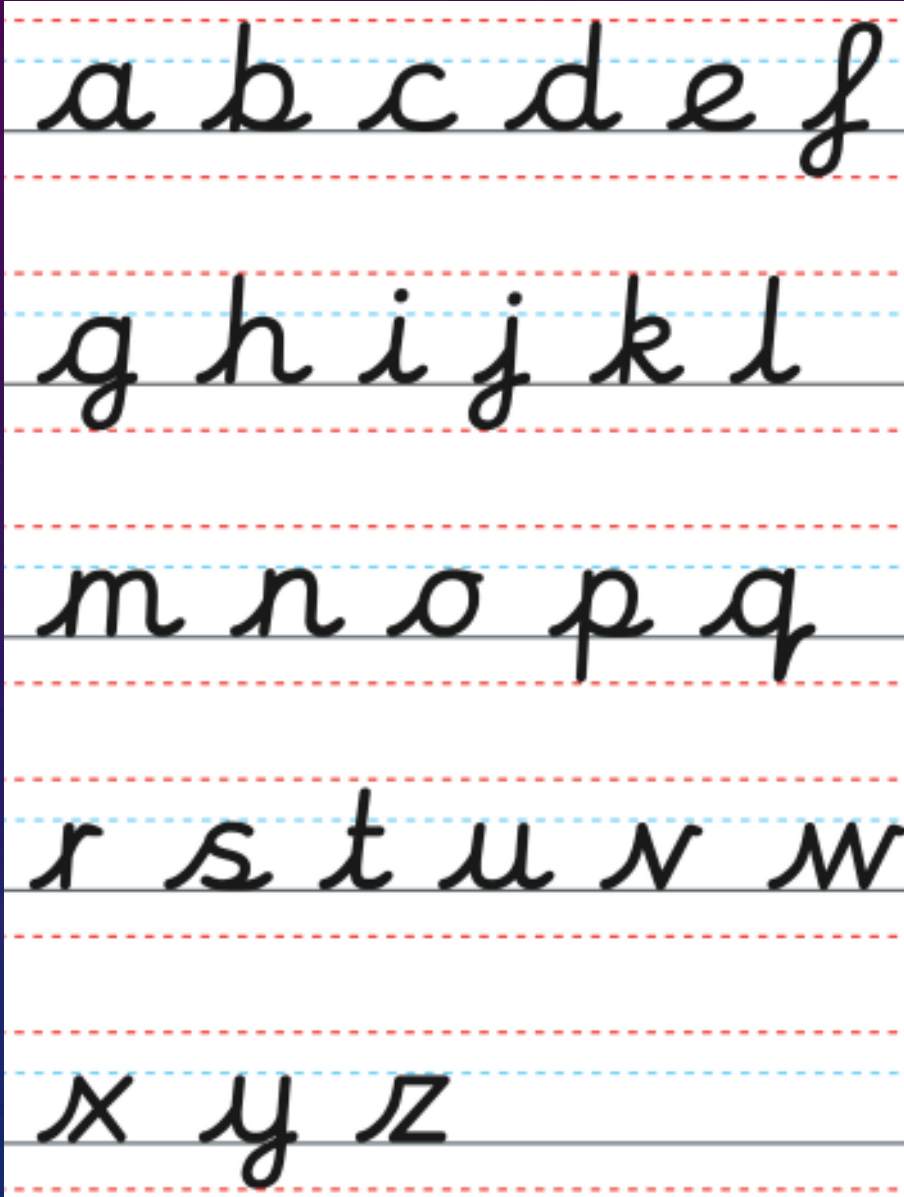


Google classroom

- Google classroom will be used as the platform to communicate work should your child need to self-isolate.



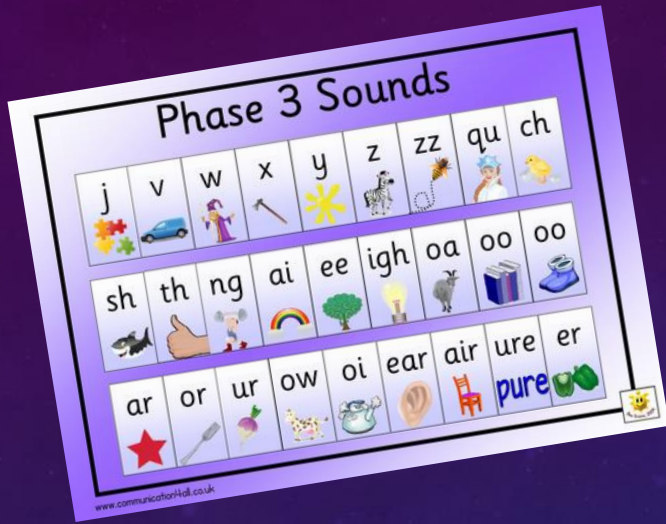
Handwriting

Phonics screening check

- Carried out in June
- One-to-one setting
- Comprised of 20 real words and 20 'alien' (pseudo) words
- Tests the children's ability to decode words

Reading

- 20 minutes each night.
- Ensure you are asking your child questions about the book after reading to check comprehension.
- Benchmarking at the end of term.
- Re-reading a book is a necessary task, which we encourage.
- Please make sure the reading record is filled out every night.
- We ask for any communication to be through the school office via email, not the reading record.
